Unemployment Rate Edges Down to 9.3%; Seasonal Gains in Public and Private Sectors

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Arizona dropped one tenth of a percentage point from 9.4% in July to 9.3% in August. The U.S. unemployment rate remained unchanged at 9.1%. In August 2010 the U. S. rate was 9.6% and Arizona's rate was 9.9% (see figure 1).

Job gains observed in both the Private Sector (+12,400) and Government (+40,200) were mostly seasonal. Back-to-school hiring within the state and local education sector boosted Total Nonfarm job gains to 52,600 (+2.3%) over the month.

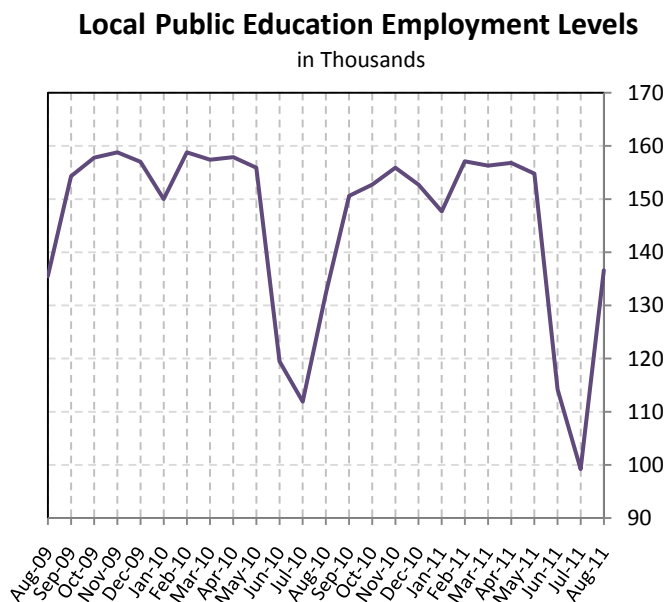
Job gains in August are typical for both the Private Sector and for the Government. The Private sector gains were at 0.6%, which was above the recent ten-year ('01-'10) average of 0.5% for August. The 11.2% gain in Government was above the 2001-2010 average of 6.8%, but this appears to be an aberration (see figure 2).

The gains in Government were from Local and State Public education gearing up for the start of the school year. Local Education added 37,400 jobs and State Education added 7,000 jobs. Losses in non-education related sectors within Government offset some of the gains resulting in a net gain of 40,200 jobs.

While job gains in Local Public Education are typical for August, the observed gains were larger than average. Part of the larger gains can be attributed to deeper than average cuts in the preceding summer months. In addition, back to school gains in previous years have been more evenly distributed between August and September. However, this August

employment levels in Local Public Education are 4,300 above last year's level. In order to reach a more typical staffing level for the school year, more gains are expected in September.

All but one of the eleven major sectors added jobs over the month (see figure 3).

Government added the most jobs of all the sectors (+40,200) from the seasonal gains in Public Education. The next largest gains were in Educational and Health Services (EHS) with 4,600 jobs added. Private Education added 1,800 of the jobs in EHS. Health Care added 1,700 jobs and Social Assistance 1,100.

Leisure and Hospitality (LH) gained 3,800 jobs. This 1.5% gain was well above the 2001-2010 average of 0.6% for this sector. The LH gains were reported in Food Services and Drinking Places (+5,000) with offsetting losses in Accommodation

Over-the-Month Job Gain or Loss by Sector, in thousands

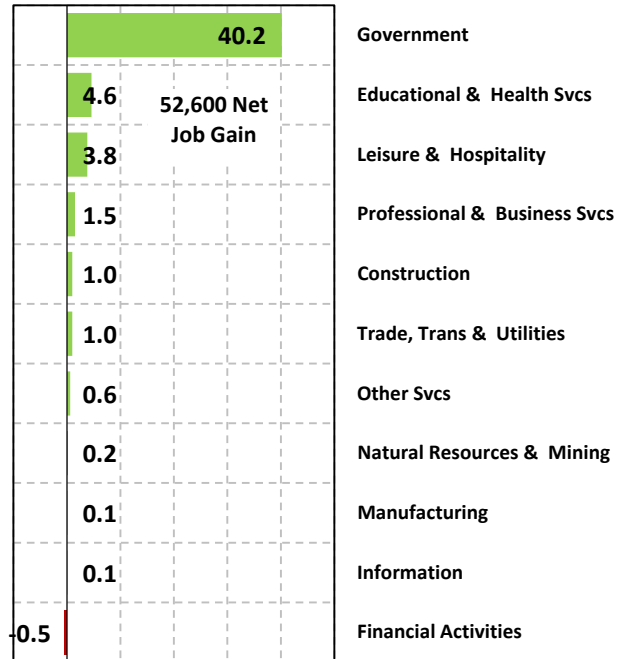
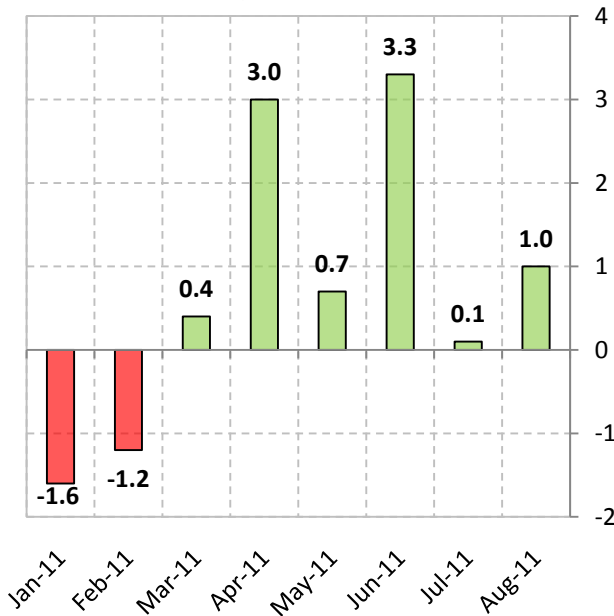

Construction Job Gain or Loss Jan - Aug 2011, in thousands



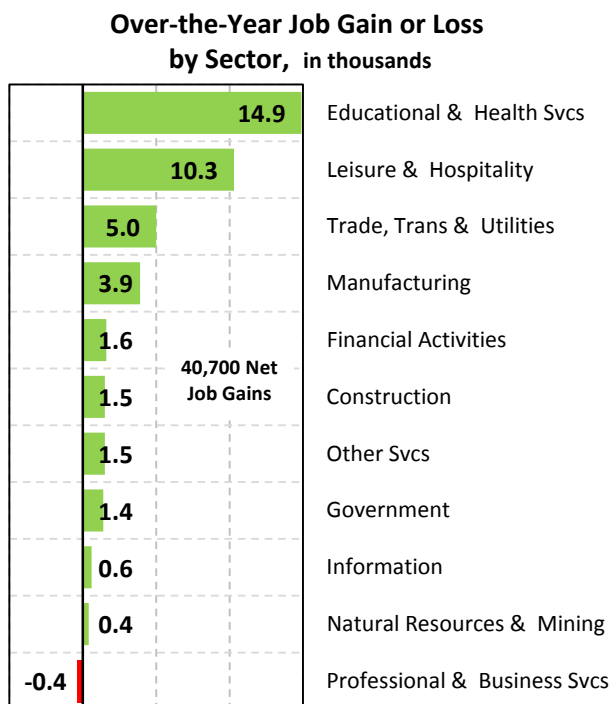
(-1,100) and Arts, Entertainment and Recreation (-100).

Professional and Business Services (PBS) added 1,500 jobs. The gains were in Employment Services (+2,500) and Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services (+900). Losses in other PBS industries offset some of the gains.

For the sixth month in a row Construction (+1,000) added jobs (see figure 4). Specialty Trades accounted for 700 of the job gains. Construction of Buildings added 200 and Heavy Construction gained 100. In August, the ten-year ('01-'10) average for Construction was a gain of 500 jobs. In the prior three years, losses were observed in the Construction Sector in August.

The Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (TTU) sector added 1,000 jobs. The gains were in Retail Trade (+1,500) and

Wholesale Trade (+500). Losses in Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities (-1,000) offset some of the TTU gains.

Other Services (+600), Natural Resources and Mining (+200), Manufacturing (+100) and Information (+100) all added jobs. Financial Activities (-500) was the only sector to lose jobs in August.

Over the year, total nonfarm employment increased by 40,700 or 1.7%. Gains were observed in all but one sector (see figure 5).

Educational and Health Services EHS added the most jobs over the year with a gain of 14,900. Health Care accounted for 12,700 of the job gains in EHS. Educational Services added 1,400 and Social Assistance 800 jobs.

The next largest over-the-year increase was in Leisure and Hospitality (LH) with 10,300 jobs added. Food Services and Drinking Places added 7,300 of the jobs in LH. Trade, Transportation and Utilities added 5,000 jobs. Transportation and Warehousing added 3,500 of the TTU jobs. Wholesale Traded gained 1,200 and Retail Trade 700 jobs over the year.

Manufacturing added 3,900 jobs. Within Manufacturing the Durable Goods industries added 2,700 job and Nondurable Goods added 1,200. Financial Activities gained 1,600 jobs for the year. Construction had a net gain of 1,500 jobs over the year. This is the second month in a row that Construction has been positive over the year. Prior to the last two months, the last time Construction was positive over the year was December 2006. All of the gains were in Specialty Trades (+3,400) with losses in Heavy Construction (-1,100) and Construction of Buildings (-800) offsetting some the gains.

Other Services added 1,500 jobs. Government added 1,400, mostly from gains in Local Public Education (+4,300) with losses in other Government agencies offsetting some of the gains. Federal Government was down 600 jobs from a year ago. Information (+600), and Natural Resources and Mining (+400) both had gains over the year.

Professional and Business Services (-400), was the only sector where over-the-year losses were observed. The losses in this sector were in the Services to Buildings and Dwellings (-2,200) and Employment Services industries (-1,000). Other industries within this sector posted job gains.

Summary

The Arizona seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped one tenth of a percentage point from 9.4% in July to 9.3% in August. The U.S. rate remained unchanged at 9.1%. Total Nonfarm employment in Arizona gained 52,600 jobs for the month. The Private Sector job gains (+0.6%) were above the 0.5% average from 2001-2010. All but one of the eleven major sectors gained jobs. Government (40,200) led all sectors for gains, with most of the gains in Public Education. The 11.2% gain in Government was above the 2001-2010 average of 6.8%. Part of the larger gains could be attributed to deeper than average cuts in the preceding summer months and some shifting of the calendar year. Educational and Health Services was a distant second with 4,600 jobs gained. Leisure and Hospitality gained an above average 3,800 jobs for the month. Construction (+1,000) added jobs for the sixth month in a row.

Over the year total nonfarm employment was up 40,700 jobs or 1.7%. Most of the increase was from the unusual gains in Public Education, but some other sectors also had better than average increases. All of the major sectors except Professional and Business Services (-400) were positive over the year. Educational and Health Services (+14,900) and Leisure and Hospitality (+10,300) had the most private sector gains.

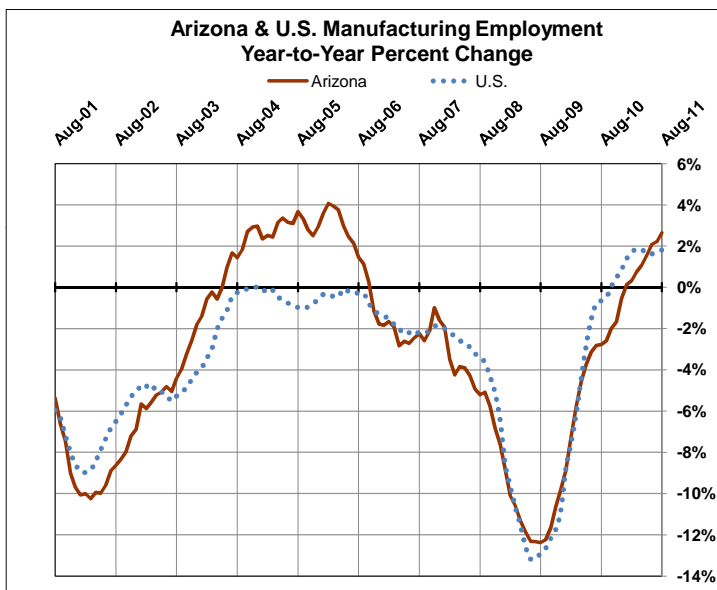

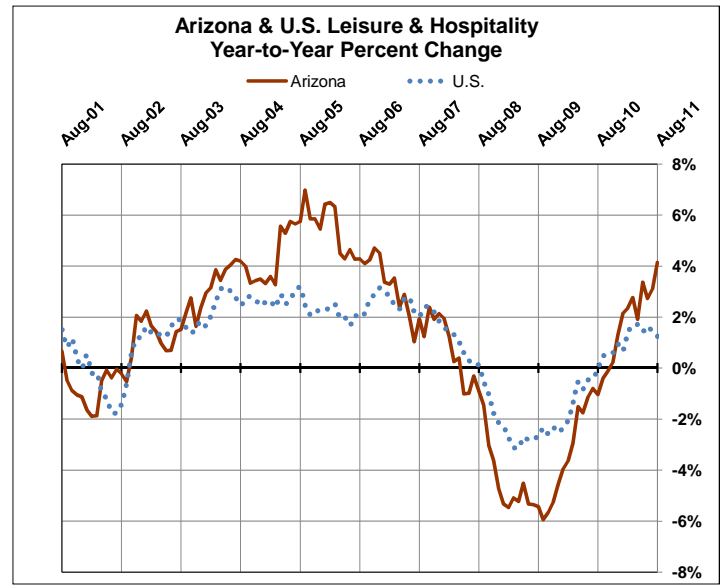
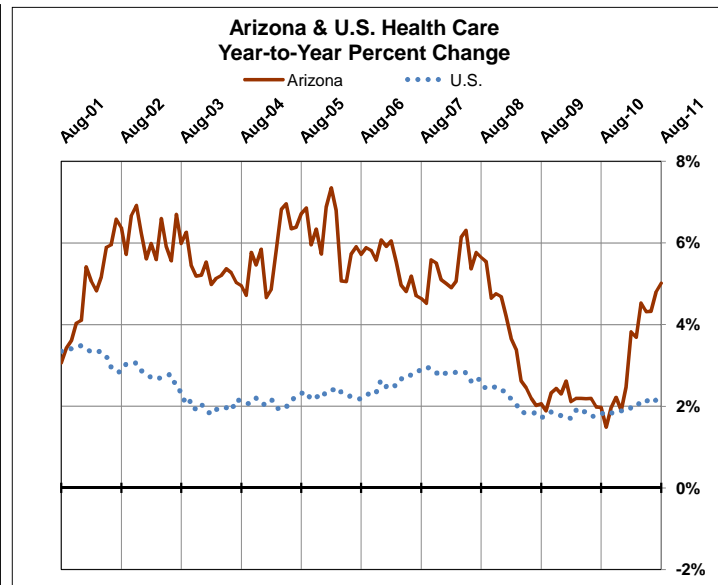
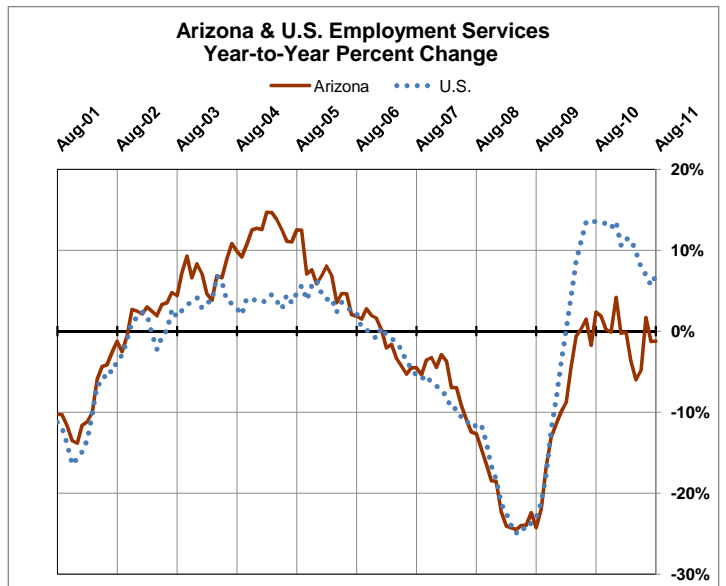
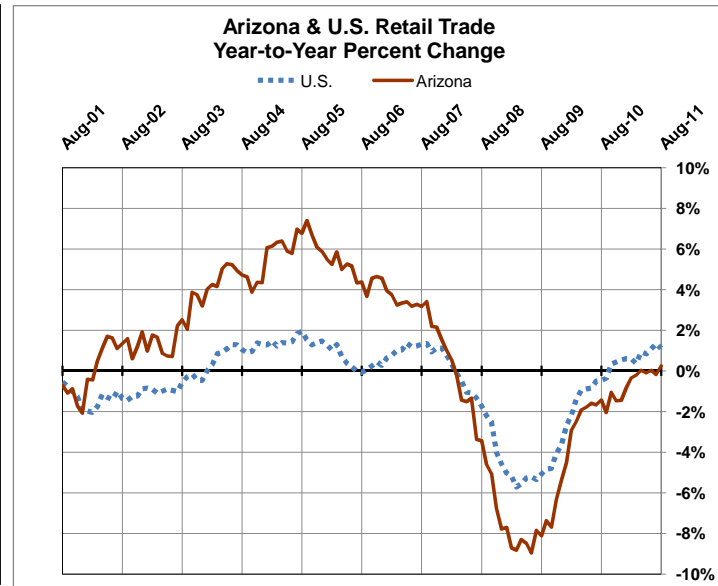
